Positive COVID-19 case, symptomatic people and home contacts

Reminder of the instructions issued by the Direction régionale de santé publique

Instructions:

IMPORTANT:

A person who had COVID-19 after December 20th, 2021 is considered immune for 60 days. The following instructions do not apply to this person, but if they are showing symptoms of infection (example: fever, diarrhea, etc.), they should stay home until their condition improves.

A PERSON WHO DEVELOPS SYMPTOMS OF COVID MUST:

(See COVID-19 symptoms)

- Follow the instructions that apply to a case.

SELF-ISOLATE.

- The members of the family bubble must also isolate themselves, for the same duration as the symptomatic person.
- Take a rapid test IMMEDIATELY, if available*.
- Take a second rapid test 24 to 36 hours after, if the first rapid was negative.
- PCR test done in a Designated Screening Center 24 hours after the onset of symptoms is strongly recommended for staff members.



Instructions for COVID-19 cases (rapid or laboratory test) OR SYMPTOMATIC people (without initial access to a test)

Promptly **notify** the school administration.

Children LESS than 12 years old

- Self-isolation for 5 days from the date of onset of symptoms.
- Screening with a rapid test on the last day of isolation (Day 5), if available.
 - If the result is NEGATIVE, the child can return to school, if they haven't had a fever for at least 24 hours without using fever medication AND their symptoms have improved;
 - If the result is POSITIVE, OR if a test is NOT AVAILABLE, the child must stay in isolation for another 5 days.
 - From Day 5, obtaining a negative result to a rapid test would allow the lifting of the isolation, if the child hasn't had a fever for at least 24 hours without using fever medication AND their symptoms have improved. The rapid tests must be taken 24 HOURS APART.

People 12 years old OR MORE

If adequately vaccinated:

- Self-isolation for 5 days from the date of onset of symptoms.
 Return to school is allowed when the following conditions are met:
 - The case hasn't had a fever for at least 24 hours without using fever medication;
 - · Their symptoms have improved.
- Wearing a procedural mask at all times and physical distancing of 2 meters for the next 5 days.

If NOT adequately vaccinated:

- Self-isolation for 10 days from
- the date of onset of symptoms.

People who live with the positive case / the symptomatic person (High risk contacts)

Home contact LESS than 12 years old

- Self-isolation for 5 days minimum from the date of onset of symptoms of the FIRST positive case or symptomatic person in the household.
- ONE negative RAPID test on or after day 5 is required to lift isolation before day 10.

Home contact (or sexual partner) 12 years old OR MORE

- ADEQUATELY VACCINATED:
- Self-isolation for 5 days from the onset of symptoms of the FIRST positive case or symptomatic person in the household.
- NOT ADEQUATELY VACCINATED:
 Self-isolation for 10 days from the onset of symptoms of the FIRST positive case or symptomatic person in the household.
- * If the household contact develops **symptoms** during this period, they will be considered a **case** and must **follow the instructions above**.
